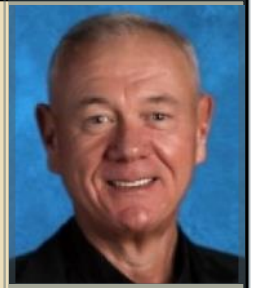

Our Challenge

Dear friends,



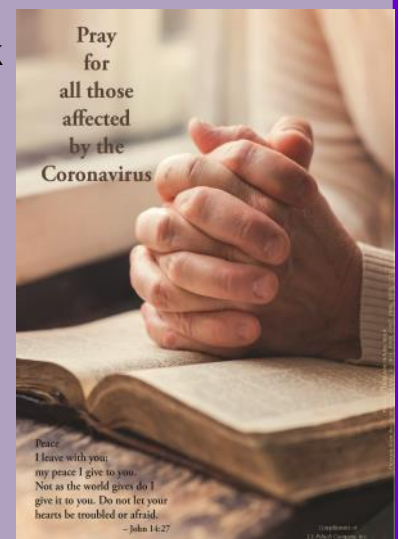
God's chosen people had lost everything: their temple, their homeland, their freedom. Ezekiel appeared as a prophet of hope. He spoke to the people that God had the power to raise them from the dead and restore them. But God's timetable is not always the same as ours. St. Paul understood that the resurrection of Jesus was God's promise that the faithful would share in this great victory over sin and death. But God is not time-bound. God's kingdom will come in God's own time, and we must trust in God's wisdom. In our gospel passage this weekend we see both Jesus' power over death and his sorrow over the death of a friend. Jesus was one of us. He knew the pain of a broken heart. He could weep over news of a friend's death and at the prospect of his own death. Whatever makes us weep is not foreign to Jesus. Because of death's certainty and finality, we tend to think of it as the ultimate threat and our worst enemy. Most people do not have to live very long to realize that there are a number of things worse than death. Physical death may come as an appropriate ending to our lives. Spiritual death has no such ambiguity. Jesus wept for Lazarus even though he knew he would be restored to life. Our challenge is to weep and pray for all who suffer, whatever their needs, and whatever may be the final outcome. The refrain from the poem entitled "The Stolen Child," by W. B. Yeats, reads *"Come away, O human child! To the waters and the wild, With a faery, hand in hand, For the world's more full of weeping than you can understand."* Followers of Christ are called into situations where there is sorrow and weeping. The poet is right, there is more weeping in the world than anyone sees. Often the very best we can do is simply be present with a grieving person. Jesus said, *"In this world you will have tribulation. But be of good cheer. I have overcome the world."*

Additional Postponement Notice:

Our annual **St. Aloysius St. Vincent de Paul 'Fill Up the Truck'** event, scheduled for Saturday, April 5, 2020, has been postponed indefinitely.

What are we doing?

Pastoral Council.

We'll be meeting again by conference call this coming Monday evening, March 30, 2020.

Church staff meetings.

They are still being conducted weekly by conference call, and more frequently as circumstances arise.

Finance Council.

While 'face to face' monthly meetings have been temporarily suspended, members will be reviewing monthly Church, School, and Child Care Center finance reports and reviewing 2020-2021 preliminary budgets via email correspondence.

Stewardship of Offering.

Speaking of finances, I'm aware that many of our families are hard-hit by the temporary severity of the market drop and curtailment of their income livelihoods. If any become hard-pressed for necessities, *do* contact me personally. We are deeply grateful to many who...even in the midst of all their own personal anxieties and uncertainties...have reached out with concern for St. Aloysius, its staff, and its financial solvency. Without weekend Masses and the accompanying collections, our challenges and budget adjustments will not be unlike the challenges many of our parishioners will be facing. We've planned for such contingencies, and with the ongoing vigilance of our Finance Council, limited operating reserves will keep us 'above water' for a while. We're also very blessed that so many of our regular givers utilize twice-monthly [ACH automated bank draft](#) or EFT for their stewardship of offering. Given our temporary inability to 'pass the basket' at Masses, envelope users are welcome to drop their envelopes by---or send them in *via* USPS mail to---our office, or temporarily create a profile at this link church.aloysius.org/give to utilize our account with *Vanco Payment Solutions* to securely process one-time or recurring contributions *via* a major credit card.

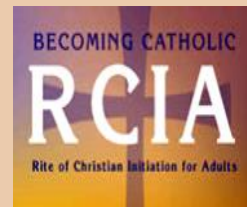

COVID19 UPDATE MARCH 24, 2020

Dear friends,

Men's ACTS retreat scheduled for April 16-19, 2020, has been *postponed* to the fall.

'Grab 'n Go' drive-thru meal pick-up for students

Only initiated last week..has been *suspended until further notice* at all school distribution sites locally, including St. Aloysius. Only after the sites were established and up-and-running were they informed of daily health screening and PPE required of food service personnel delivering the program, which sites were unable to requisition and acquire because the equipment is backordered and earmarked first for medical personnel. That factor, coupled with staffing issues at some sites owing to yesterday's 'stay at home' order, resulted in suspension of the service. There is a chance that it may be resumed, so stay tuned.

Consistent with our bishop's latest update this morning www.diobr.org, our **St. Aloysius Pastoral Services Center building** has been CLOSED to visitors. However, a skeleton crew of our Church staff is at work in the building and are able to receive and answer calls, or retrieve and return voice mail messages, as well as receive and reply to email messages [Staff](#) who are able to work from home are doing so, and to drop off mail and deliveries during published weekday business hours, visitors are able to be 'buzzed' into the lobby. If no reply is forthcoming from ringing the doorbell, call the Church office number: 225-343-6657. All full time and part time >20 staff continue to receive their pay. Custodial and maintenance essential staff are working on-site on adjusted staggered shifts, observing social-distancing measures, and assuring the safety, security, operational readiness, and cleanliness of all our facilities.

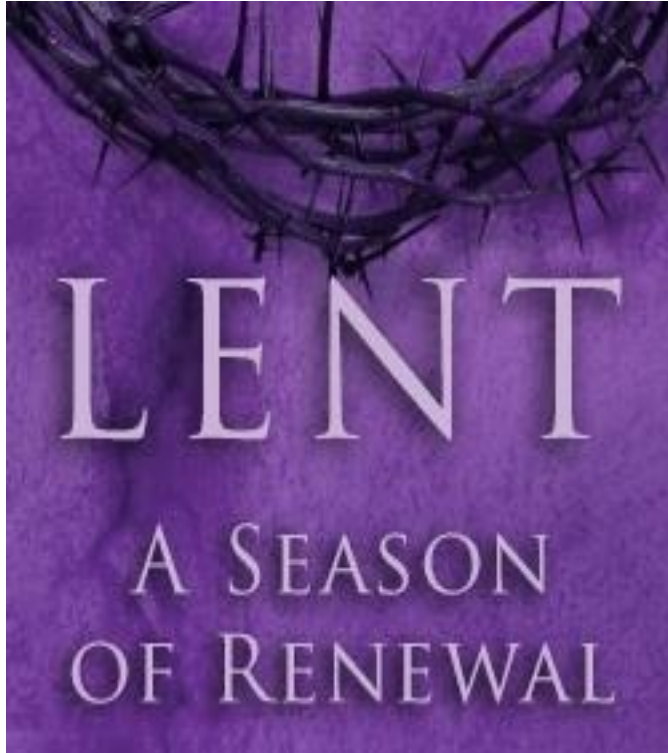
Our **Pastoral Council** met again by conference call last evening to assess the progress made by our ministries in just the last week with initiatives to keep our parishioners connected and as active as possible in the activities and services of our ministries. Links have been posted at our website to sign up to help us reach out to all the households of our parish to check on them and see if they have needs with which we can help. Many are gathering **on-line in prayer and common recitation of devotions**. Both Fr. Ryan and I will be posting the **audio-recordings of our Sunday homilies** to our website in advance of the weekend, and Fr. Ryan will be posting videos of his **recorded Sunday Mass**, *albeit* without the 'bells and whistles' to which we are accustomed at our in-person Sunday Masses.

On-line Baptism Seminars are in the works, as is the **First Communion Retreat program** for parents and our First Communion candidates. So....stay tuned as we continue to adjust to our new reality, still in hopes that it will be short-lived!
