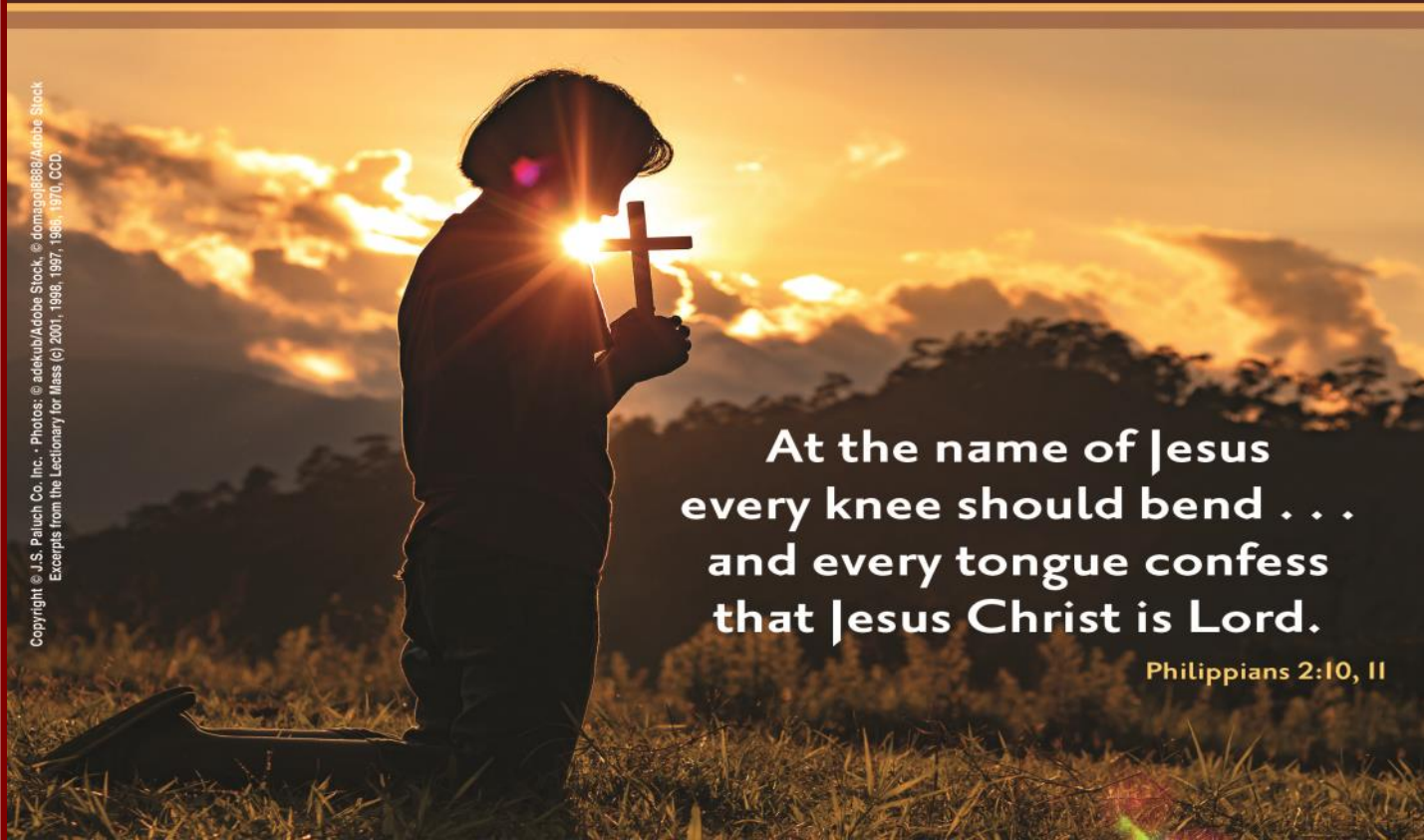

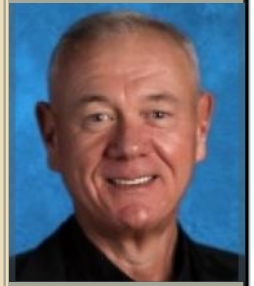

Our Challenge



Dear friends,

In his last hours, Jesus practiced what he had taught. He did not defend himself to his enemies. He did not return hate with hate. Had he done so, he would have negated everything he had said. True to God, to Himself, and to his teachings, Jesus endured suffering and death for the sake of love. St. Paul recognized that things are upside-down in the kingdom of God. Those who humble themselves before God will be lifted up. Those who suffer on behalf of others will be honored. The one who take on the form of a servant will be crowned as a king. The suffering of Jesus - - his arrest, his physical and public humiliation, and his execution - - shows how the world feels about inclusive love. Such love crosses all the boundaries we have established to protect ourselves and give us advantages. Jesus was put to death by people who loved only their own. We like to blame Jesus' death on those who had the power to kill him. But responsibility for the cross rests on the shoulders of everyone who could not accept his love for all people. When the people saw him as their Messiah, they shouted, "*Hosanna!*" When they saw how he loved their enemies, they shouted, "*Crucify him!*" On Passion (Palm) Sunday every year we concentrate our attention on the suffering of our Lord. Our challenge is not to see Christ Jesus alone, but others who are suffering unjustly and facing a dark, foreboding future. All manner of human groups, from civic clubs to entire cultures, reveal their true values in the individuals they honor, idolize, or emulate. Since its early days Israel had been enamored with the idea of having a king. A nation's power, wealth, and cultural distinctions were personified in a monarch. Despite the fact that kingship was a failure for Israel, the people never lost their infatuation. When Jesus came, many clamored to make him a king. When they realized what kind of king he would be, they crucified him. Are we still trying to make Jesus a king in what we want him to be and to do?

Set up a prayer area in your home. For Palm Sunday the space may include a red cloth, a special crucifix or cross, the family bible, candles, palm branches and other green branches from the yard or garden. There should be a branch for each person.

Family members will need to take on different liturgical roles. You will need a Leader (mother and father could share this role), several Readers and Servers to assist. Music for Palm Sunday: <https://open.spotify.com/playlist/1eIB7C5uvyBUQPVyFATLAP> When it is time to begin the prayer, the candles are lighted, the Leader invites everyone to make the Sign of the Cross.

Our Father Provides

One day, a little boy stood waving a smudgy red flag at the side of a railroad track. Off in the distance a freight engine and a single caboose were approaching slowly down the track. A man who stood watching all this was prompted to walk over and say to the boy. "*You don't think that train is going to stop for you just because you are waving that flag, do you?*" Then he added cynically, "*Don't waste your time.*" The little boy made no answer but kept on waving the flag. As the man looked on, to his utter amazement he saw the train slow down and finally come to a stop, just in front of the boy. The boy put the flag down and scrambled up the side of the engine into the cab. As he reached the top, the boy looked back at the man and said with a knowing smile, "*The engineer is my father.*" Sometimes, people chide us for praying to God as we do. They say, as the man said to the little boy, "*Don't waste your time,*" but they forget that God is our Father.

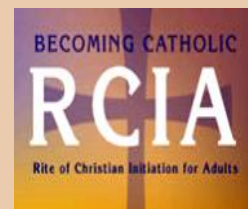

Speaking of finances, I'm aware that many of our families are hard-hit by the temporary severity of the market drop and curtailment of their income livelihoods. If any become hard-pressed for necessities, *do* contact me personally. We are deeply grateful to many who...even in the midst of all their own personal anxieties and uncertainties...have reached out with concern for St. Aloysius, its staff, and its financial solvency. Without weekend Masses and the accompanying collections, our challenges and budget adjustments will not be unlike the challenges many of our parishioners will be facing. We've planned for such contingencies, and with the ongoing vigilance of our Finance Council, limited operating reserves will keep us 'above water' for a while. We're also very blessed that so many our regular givers utilize twice-monthly [ACH automated bank draft](#) or EFT for their stewardship of offering. Given our temporary inability to 'pass the basket' at Masses, envelope users are welcome to drop their envelopes by---or send them in *via* USPS mail to---our office, or temporarily create a profile at this link church.aloysius.org/give to utilize our account with *Vanco Payment Solutions* to securely process one-time or recurring contributions *via* a major credit card.

We will contact you with how you can help.

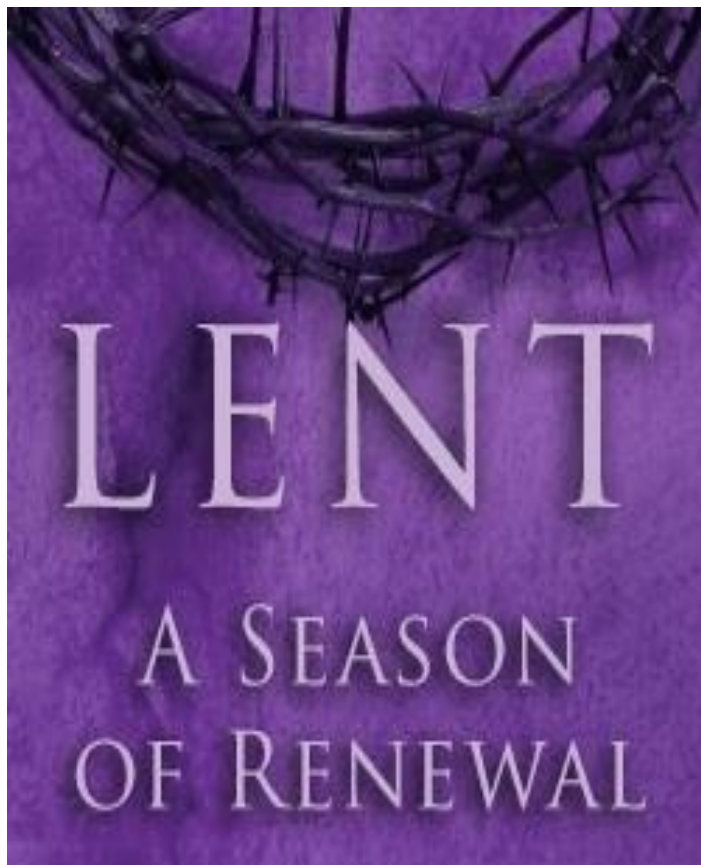
